POINTS OF INTEREST

- Ten of Joseph Smith's wives were teenage girls –two 14 year old and two 16 year old girls.
- Joseph married a mother and her daughter Patty Bartlett Sessions and Sylvia Sessions Lyon.

God said, "If a man take a wife and her mother, it is wickedness: they shall be burned with fire, both he and they; that there be no wickedness among you" Leviticus 20:14, see also Lev. 18:17.

• Joseph married several sets of sisters (Huntingtons, Partridges, Johnsons, Lawrences)

God said, "Neither shalt thou take a wife to her sister... to uncover her nakedness, beside the other in her lifetime" Leviticus 18:18.

Eleven marriages were to women who had living husbands. All of these married women lived in ongoing 'polyandrous' relationships with both their husbands and Joseph Smith.

God said, "The man that committeth adultery with another man's wife... the adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death" Leviticus 20:10.

Marrying married women was also adultery according to Joseph's own teachings,

"If any man espouse a virgin, and desire to espouse another, and the first give her consent... and they are virgins, and have vowed to no other man, then is he justified; he cannot commit adultery for they are given unto him; for he cannot commit adultery with that that belongeth unto him and to no one else... But if one or either of the ten virgins, after she is espoused, shall be with another man, she has committed adultery" D&C 132:61-63.
