- **#1.** According to the LDS Church, The Book of Mormon was "translated by the gift and power of God." (Book of Mormon —Introduction)
- #2. The Prophet Joseph Smith said: "I told the brethren that the Book of Mormon was the most correct of any book on earth, and the keystone of our religion, and a man would get nearer to God by abiding by its precepts, than by any other book." (Book of Mormon—Introduction)
- **#3.** "The Testimony of the Three Witnesses"—these three men said, "We also know that they have been translated by the gift and power of God, for his voice hath declared it unto us; wherefore we know of a surety that the work is true."
- **#4. The Translation Process was Miraculous**—David Whitmer said, "In the darkness the spiritual light would shine. A piece of something resembling parchment would appear, and under it was the interpretation in English. Brother Joseph would read off the English to Oliver Cowdery, who was his principal scribe, and when it was written down and repeated to brother Joseph to see if it was correct, then it would disappear, and another character with the interpretation would appear. Thus the Book of Mormon was translated by the gift and power of God."

Martin Harris said, "By aid of the Seer Stone, sentences would appear and were read by the Prophet, and written by Martin, and when finished he would say, 'written;' and if correctly written, the sentence would disappear and another appear in its place; but if not written correctly it remained until corrected, so that the translation was just as it was engraven on the plates, precisely in the language then used." (A Comprehensive History of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, by B.H. Roberts, Century One, Volume I, pp. 128-129.)

The 1st edition of the Book of Mormon was published in 1830.

1837 edition, Book of Mormon—Meaningful Changes

- ① 1830 Book of Mormon, pg.25 said, "Behold, the virgin which thou seest, is the mother of God, after the manner of the flesh... the angel said unto me, behold the Lamb of God, yea, even the Eternal Father!""

 1 Nephi 11:18, 21 was changed to, "Behold, the virgin which thou seest, is the mother of the Son of God, after the manner of the flesh... And the angel said unto me, behold the Lamb of God, yea, even the Son of the Eternal Father!"
- ② The 1830 Book of Mormon, pg.26 said, "And I looked and beheld the Lamb of God, that he was taken by the people; yea, the Everlasting God was judged of the world..."
 - 1 Nephi 11:32 was changed to, "And I looked and behold the Lamb of God, that he was taken by the people; yea, the Son of the Everlasting God was judged of the world..."
- ③ The 1830 Book of Mormon, pg. 32 said, "and shall make known to all kindreds, tongues, and people, that the Lamb of God is the Eternal Father and the Saviour of the world;"
 - 1 Nephi 13:40 was changed to, "and shall make known to all kindreds, tongues, and people, that <u>the Lamb of God is the Son of the Eternal Father</u> and the Saviour of the world;"
- ④ The 1830 Book of Mormon, pg. 200 said, "King Benjamin had a gift from God, whereby he could interpret such engravings"

Mosiah 21:28 was changed to, "<u>King Mosiah</u> had a gift from God, whereby he could interpret such engravings;"
[Evidently this change was necessary becauseKing Benjamin died in Mosiah 6:5]

⑤The 1830 Book of Mormon, pg. 546 said, "and for this cause did <u>king</u> <u>Benjamin</u> keep them;"

Ether 4:1 says, "and for this cause did king Mosiah keep them;"

1981 edition, Book of Mormon—Meaningful Change

- © The 1830 Book of Mormon, pg. 117 said, "and many generations shall not pass away among them, save they shall be a white and a delightsome people."
 - 2 Nephi 30:6 says, "and many generations shall not pass away among them, save they <u>shall be a pure and a delightsome</u> <u>people</u>."
